

Facility Information:

WABC has quality city water, natural gas to all the facilities and every building has heat and air-conditioning! High-speed DSL wireless access. Password is available upon request to staff only. Please use the internet for your camp staff needs and limit personal use.

Campground: (3 sites near office, 4 sites behind chapel)

7 RV sites - Water / Electricity / Septic

2 - 50 amp sites - all back-ins

5 - 30 amp sites - all back-ins

Chapel:

Seats approximately 168 in padded pews plus 50 chairs that be set up for more people (218 total). Multimedia projector, wired and wireless microphones, Yamaha Portable Digital Grand Piano, and a sound booth with, DVD player, and connections for your laptop to be used.

There is a classroom/prayer room near the bathrooms.

Dining Hall / Kitchen:

Seats up 140 people (metal folding chairs & 8' tables)

Ice machine, tea maker, coffee maker with hot water dispenser (teas, etc.), salad bar, two booster chairs and three high-chairs.

Coffee and Ice Tea is provided as a free amenity for your group. Normal usage is appreciated.

Durable plastic plates, tumblers, bowls, metal silverware, coffee cups for up to 150 people. Paper goods (cups, plates, napkins, towels) are **not** available.

Kitchen has a convection oven, two 6 burners stoves with ovens, built-in steam table, prep area with utensils and spices, deep freezer, upright freezer, refrigerators, dishwasher, large tub sinks, large capacity prep pots and bowls.

The Oasis:

This is the camp store which is open during lunch and dinner and in the afternoon per request.

On hand and reasonably priced are slushies, snacks, candy, hot and cold drinks, books, toys, knickknacks, gifts, and clothes.

Cabins:

Every guest room, guest cabin and bunk cabin have heat and air-conditioning with total sleeping capacity of 200 people:

Duplex style cabins - each sleeps 4-5 (full-size bed and 2-3 single beds) with bathrooms. Each guest cabin have linens and towels provided

- Cabins "Aspen & Beech" each have tub with shower
- Cabins "Cedar & Douglas" each have showers only
- Chapel cabins (two) connected to the outside of chapel - each room sleeps 3-4 (full-size bed and 1 bunk bed). Each guest room have linens and towels provided.
 - Cabins "Fir, & Gum" share the chapel bathrooms but the showers are in the gym
- There are 8 "bunk" cabins with bunk beds - each sleeps up to 17 or 19 including a counselor bed
 - Cabins "1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8" have bathrooms attached (2 showers, 2 toilets, & 2 sinks each)
- Cabins "Dogwood & Birch" are air-conditioned and sleep 10 each with a shower, toilet and two sinks

Gym:

Full-size basketball court which can be converted into two separate volleyball / basketball court areas - heated but not air-conditioned. All other rooms are heated and air-conditioned.

Available for use: Kitchenette and "craft room, meetings rooms, and bathrooms with showers - great for Lock-ins.

Outdoor sport amenities:

Ga-Ga Ball Pits - Basketball / volleyball court

In-ground pool with diving board and water-slide

Softball / soccer field - Children and toddler swings

WABC Camp rules:

Each party is responsible for clean-up according to rental agreement and arrangements made during stay.

If you must bring your pet, they must be leashed or in a portable kennel at all times. Pets are not allowed in any building for any reason. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after pet and any damage that the pet does to any building siding, post, etc. including other people's property (ie. cleaning of shoes if pet droppings are not properly cleaned up.)

Following are the rules that apply to every WABC camper (Please follow these rules for your group):

Every camper is responsible for his or her own luggage, bedding, and personal belongings. We highly recommend that the camper's name be placed on all personal items.

All campers are under the direction and supervision of the Operations Director, Camp Director, Assistant Camp Director, Senior Staff (Program, Music, Activities, Lifeguard Cook, etc.), Counselors and Assistant Counselors at all times.

Clothing:

Some kind of foot wear must be worn at all times. No sleeveless shirts (top of shirt must overhang shoulders no less than 1", tank tops, questionable imprints, or improper clothing will be allowed. Shorts are to be no shorter than three inches above the knee.

Swimsuits for girls must be a modest one piece, or a non-white colored shirt must be worn over the swimsuit. Boys must also wear modest swimsuits. A towel and shirt, or a robe must be worn to and from the pool.

WABC reserves the right to ask any camper to change his or her clothing due to violation of camp regulations. Failure to comply will result in the sending home of the camper at the parent's expense, and the balance of the camp fees are not refundable.

Conduct:

Cursing, foul, or degrading language, or name calling of any sort will not be tolerated. First offense may result in sending home of camper at parent's expense depending on severity. The balance of the camp fees will not be refunded.

Campers must have the permission from the Camp Director in order to use the telephone for emergencies only. Family and friends are encouraged to email or send letters.

Conduct (con't):

Cell phones, camera phones, radios, CD's, DVD's, CD/DVD players, mp-3 players, recorders, comic books, are not allowed but will be returned to the camper at the end of the week. Fireworks, guns, alcohol, tobacco products, drugs, illegal paraphernalia will not be tolerated. Knives must be turned in on the first day to be given back at the end of the week. If caught, however, during the remainder of the week, we reserve the right to keep the knife and return at the parent's request only. Woodland Acres Bible Camp reserves the right to confiscate any of the above-mentioned and to report as necessary to the local authorities.

Programs:

All campers are expected to be prompt to all meals and meetings and are required to follow the entire camp schedule unless excused by the Directors, Senior Staff or the camp nurse. If you are injured or do not feel well, report at once to camp nurse and/or counselor. This is important for your safety and the good of all campers and staff.

All campers must participate in at least 15 minutes or one round of each scheduled game.

No one is to be in the swimming pool without the lifeguard or in the gym without permission and without a counselor.

All campers and workers are expected to stay their cabin from the "In Cabins" time until the "rise and shine" bell except for emergencies. Lights and noise are not permitted in the cabin after lights out.

We will provide a running tab of Snack Shack and Store purchase during camp week. The tab will be based on the amount received at the beginning of camp during registration. Camper will be notified when they are near the limit. Any over-expenditures will be paid by parent at time the camper is picked-up. WABC is not responsible for the theft or loss of any money that is not turned in at the time of registration.

Grounds:

Campers are expected to stay within the camp boundaries unless Senior Staff gives permission and an adult is with them. This includes missionary staff campers for the follow "grounds" rules.

Staff housing, Laundry Room, Office and areas around are off limits without prior permission and must be assisted by an adult.

Camper and workers are not allowed in or near the cabins of the opposite gender. Boys may go in other boy's cabin and girls over to girls with the permission from counselors or Senior Staff and must be assisted by an adult.

No food, candy, drinks, or gum is allowed in the chapel or pool areas unless prior permission is given by Director's or Lifeguard. Pop cans and trash are to be put into designated containers. Please keep the camp looking nice!

Athletic equipment in the gym and in the Sports Shack is under the supervision of the Camp Director, Assistant Camp Director, Senior Staff, or Counselor and may be used as they directs.

Camp Policies:

Concerning Fighting: Physical and verbal fighting is not tolerated! First offense of fighting will receive a warning from the Camp Director, and a possible call to the parents / guardians. Second offense could result in sending home of the camper via the parent / guardian at the parent / guardian expense. Workers sent home due to fighting will not receive a refund for camp fee or pay (if available).

Concerning Homesickness: Camp is a wonderful experience for most people. Sometimes, some experience homesickness during their stay at camp. We encourage the campers to get involved, and often when they do, they forget about missing home. However, occasionally, the camper may persist in calling home. Campers will be allowed to call home only under the Camp Director's supervision. They will make the first contact with you. Parents / guardians are encouraged to persuade their camper to stay for the full time. In the event that the parent / guardian wants to pick up their camper, no refund of unused camp fee will be made. As campers are often homesick after they have spoken with parents, we ask that unless it is an emergency, you not call your camper, nor ask the camper to call you.

Concerning sickness or injury: In the event your camper becomes ill or is injured, either the Camp Nurse or the Camp Director will call you and inform you of the situation. Calls will not come directly from the camper.
